Update

In September 2018, it was reported that the review of annual monitoring had been overtaken by plans for a project associated with the Evidence-led Enhancement Theme. Funding from the enhancement theme is to be used to employ two interns to conduct interviews with key stakeholders in annual monitoring, Heads of School, Learning & Teaching Conveners, Quality Officers, etc, to gather views on how annual monitoring could be more useful and integrated with other activity. Unfortunately, the recruitment process has been severely delayed due to systems issues, however, it is now progressing with interviews being held on 20 May 2019. Following this, the newly appointed interns will begin work as soon as possible. A communication introducing the interns and explaining the process will be sent to all stakeholders shortly. We expect proposals to come to ASC in October 2019.

In the meantime, amendments to the College Annual Monitoring Form for the current session have been agreed with the College Quality Officers. These are intended to simplify and streamline reporting to ASC. The draft form is attached for information as **Appendix 1**. Comments are welcome before the form is finalised later in May.
